### MAY, 1978

This is Sunburst Corvette Club's first attempt at an official newbletter. Due to a limited amount of time to compile articles and a staff of zero on the publication committee (Joan Dietrich is putting this newsletter together as secretary, but only temporarily), this issue is a shortened version of what we hope to print each nonth.

In future issues we hope to include monthly minutes of the business meeting, N.C.C.C.'s Governor's Report, a full-page calendar of coming events, club activity flyers, a swap page (if you have any Corvette parts to sell or are looking for anything, this will be the place to print it), an explanation of our points system along with current point standings (perhaps every other month), and possibly a page of advertising, including Albert Peter Chevrolet.

SUNBURST CORVETTE CLUB was a year old on March 23, 1978. Its first neeting was held on March 23, 1977, in the basement of the Crystal Lake Police Department. 13 people were present, and all but 2 of them went on to become charter numbers. 

# **2017 Charitable Organizations**



# **Corvette History and Interesting Facts**

C5 The "world class" Corvettes (1997 - 2004)

2001



2001 will forever be remembered as the year the Z06 performance hardtop was introduced with its 385HP LS6 engine and 6 speed manual transmission.

Corvette's use of a titanium exhaust for the Z06 was the first ever for a mass production automobile.

Active Handling became standard equipment in 2001.

2002



The 2002 Corvette featured a new color choice, Electron Blue Metallic and an upgraded 405HP LS6 engine for the Z06.

The 2002 Z06 windshield was thinner than that used in the coupe models, shaving 2.65 pounds per car. The lighter windshield was shared with convertibles equipped with the Heads Up Display (HUD) option, which was standard on 2002 Z06 models.

2003



The 2003 Corvette heralds the 50th anniversary with a special edition in Anniversary Red with Shale interior and a new, high-tech magnetic suspension option for all models but the Z06, which continues essentially unchanged from the 2002 model year.

2004



In addition to Anniversary Red, Medium Spiral Gray Metallic was a new color in 2003.

The Magnetic Ride Option offered in 2003 a magnetic fluid which adjusts shock damping 1000 times per second, roughly equivalent to reacting to each inch of road surface at 60 mph.

2004 marks the last of the extremely successful fifth generation Corvette and was celebrated with the special Commemorative #Edition corvettes in Lemans Blue with special badging, graphics and interior appointments.




